Table Two

Table two compares graduation rates, the SEI, the gap in graduation rates between Black and White, non-Hispanic male students by state, arranged by total Black male enrollment in descending order. Texas has overtaken Florida as the state with the largest enrollment of Black male students. It also has the highest graduation rate for Black male students among the ten states with the largest Black enrollments, while Michigan has the lowest, graduating barely a third of its Black male students with their Grade 9 cohort. In general, states with smaller Black enrollments have higher graduation rates for their Black male students.
